How to file complaint under s-200 CRPC?

S-200 examination of complaint

Complaint is defined under section 2(d)

Complaint simply means allegation made by complainant in front of magistrate and not to police so that he can take action accordingly.

It is different from police report -173(2) and if by mistake they found it is non cognizable offence in which they are dealing from that point of time it will be considered as complaint.

Essential of section 2(d)

- * Allegation
- * by complainant
- * in front of magistrate

Now the question is who can be a complainant?

First of all complainant simply means who can complain.

Now, the question is who can complaint

Generally, it is considered that the person who is aggrieved or the person against whom the Offence is committed will complaint

But this is not whole truth now here the concept of locus standi will not work and any person can file complaint who is aware of facts and situation. (A.R Antulay vs R.S Nayak)

MAGISTRATE- Defined under section - 12 of crpc - which is appointed by the high court to be chief judicial magistrate .

Procedure

*complaint can be orally or in writing.

Step

1.An aggrieved will move to magistrate.

2. Then magistrate will take cognizance after looking at the who le matter.
Power of magistrate
1- he will take cognizance under section- 190
2 he can also dismiss under section- 203
3 he can send summon and warrant - 202
4. order for investigations- 156(3)

156(3) Power of magistrate u/s 190 to ordee for investigating in which aggrieved moved to magistrate and not to police then magistrate has the power to order for proper investigation by the police.
Dismissal
As- 203 he can also dissmiss the complaint if found after inquiry or investigation _ no ground for proceeding
Issue of process - 202
As the case may be, he will send summon or warrant.
When magistrate not completent
He will either return that to the proper court if in writing
If in oral form then direct the complainant to go to proper court.
